Step 1: Read the letters on the alphabet card and trace with your finger.

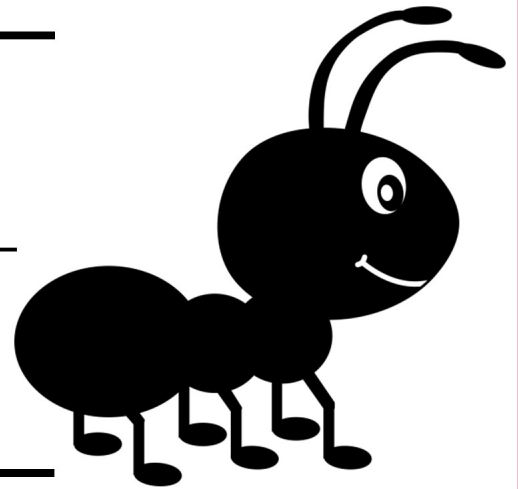
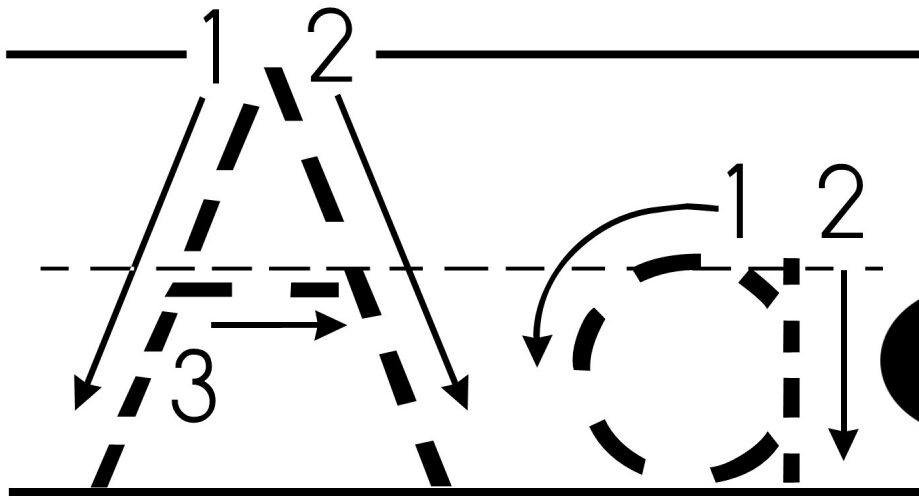
Step 2: Point to the picture and say it's name. What sound does the picture start with?

Step 3: Use a whiteboard marker to trace the letters.

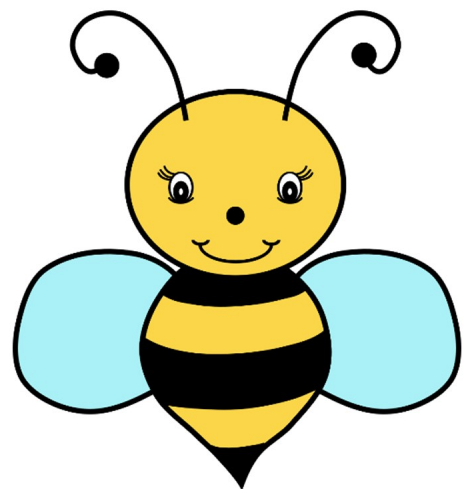
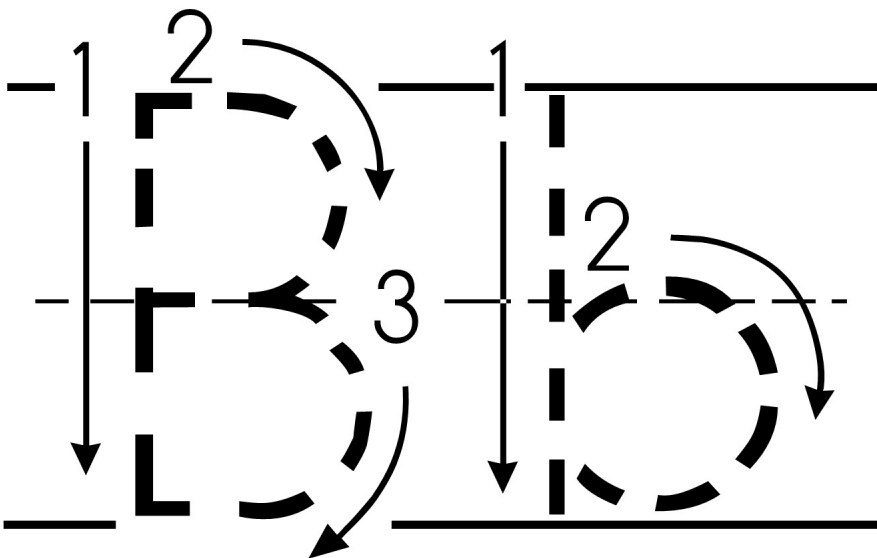
Step 4: For added practice, on a whiteboard / chalkboard / paper, practice writing the letter independently.
